- IV. Principal's Report: Ms. Dunne
  - a. Thank you, PTA, for our Howl and Spooky Walk; thank you volunteers
  - b. McVey had First Annual Balloon Race: super fun
  - c. Corey the Dribbler: Thank you; students enjoyed; extension on Wellness Week: Red Ribbon Week
  - d. Turkey Trot will be next Wednesday; parents are welcome
  - e. Winter Concert: December 8
  - f. Met with PTA on Election Day: We will be unveiling time capsule in spring; possibly on flag day followed by an evening event where those who participated can see the contents unveiled; McVey current students will create a time capsule this year for students in 50 years; every child will have something in our capsule; spearheaded by our beautification team
  - g. Working on a mural for cafeteria B: "The McVey Way"; Talented custodian Mike sketched something out; Café A- Snow White and dwarfs will be more connected and flow so the children can follow the story better

  - l. Update on Education: News release: McVey top 100 schools in state; top 10 in Nassau County; East Meadow up there with other towns such as Jericho, Roslyn, etc. Only 8 classroom teachers currently working at McVey were here when Ms. Dunne got here. Results give a lot of feedback about how we are doing and how our children are doing.

    - ii. Work on System one vs system two thinking:  
System one – more automatic  
System two- takes more thought process (Two step word problem is in system 2). Working on improving skill and then you can apply it.
  - n. Parent Teacher Conference: Monday, December 8 at 4pm; progress reports live; conferences to follow. It is a 10-minute conference. For our parents: Please look at indicators on report card and have bullet points to ask teacher in conference. We want to make sure you have a productive conference and time is utilized properly. Teachers are here at night to accommodate schedules.
- V. Assistant Principal's Report: Mr. Minerva: Update on safety report: Completed safety walk through; Current safety situations include playground mats outside; Windows hopefully get replaced in gym; district knows about these things; coming up with a plan; carpeting in front by the entrance; second bus drill out of three went well. Went over proper bus etiquette; it's important to make sure parents are not in the street so bus can properly pull up
- VI. Teacher Liason's Report: Ms. Jalfin: Not here; thanks to people who purchased books from book fair for our teachers
- VII. Superintendent's Report: Mr. Rosner:
- a. Minerva and all assistant principals went to the police department training on superintendents' day; learned situational awareness; Explained how a mock town is on site and police officers are training in this mock town.
  - b. Major problem with E-bikes zipping around neighborhoods. If you are under 16 you will get your bike confiscated; more of a high school issue. Bikes were confiscated on Sunday around McVey
  - c. Super impressive news: McVey is a top school in NYS and top 10 in Nassau County. Great Numbers
  - d. McVey Expansion Project: In 2022 community approved expansion project; included a lot of construction; got delayed and now we are in 2025 and there has been no expansion. There is a space issue at McVey; The cost has now changed by a few million. What we want: We want to get the APR back for its purpose; we want to get classrooms out of the APR; meeting to discuss this is tomorrow. I didn't make comments about this during board meeting because I wanted to come discuss the situation at McVey first before addressing it at the board meeting. We lost two sections of classrooms last year. We are going to look at those rooms. Rosner will let everyone know when he will speak more about this expansion project.

Jennifer Reinhardt: Question: What is new timeline?

Rosner: Hope to make final decision by January. Hired project manager to get new estimate. 9-10 million dollars on 3 classrooms. People may ask: Why are you asking for another 4 million dollars. And that is a legitimate question.
